

Prozac (fluoxetine)

Parent Information Sheet

Why it is prescribed

Prozac is given for the treatment of depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) and panic attacks.

How to give Prozac

- Prozac is prescribed only for use by the patient whose name appears on the prescription.
- Prozac requires adult supervision at home and at school. Your child should not be expected to remember to take the medication on his/her own. Your school will require a form for school medication administration signed by the doctor.
- Give Prozac exactly as your doctor has prescribed.
- Do not give Prozac more often or in larger doses than what your doctor has ordered. If you have any questions or concerns about the current medication, call your doctor's office.
- If you miss a dose take the missed dose as soon as possible; then take the remaining doses for that day at regularly spaced times. Do not give a double dose.

Side Effects

The most common but infrequent: chills, high blood pressure, increased appetite, vomiting, easy bruising, weight gain, agitation, confusion, sleep problems, ear pain or ringing of the ears.

Procedure for getting a prescription

- Please have your pharmacy phone number available before calling for prescription refills.
